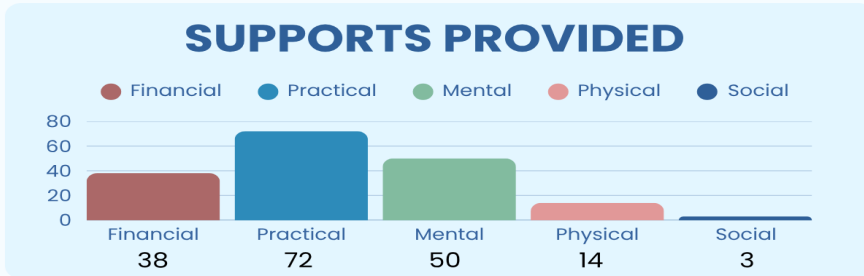

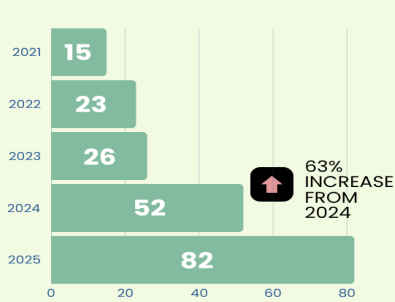

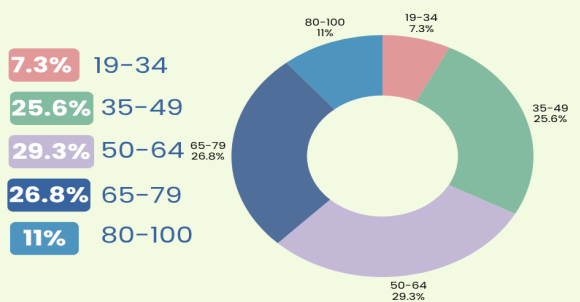

Resource Center Drop-In	Broken down into 5 primary goals including financial, practical, mental, physical, and social , we supported 82 Cherryville residents achieve 176 goals . This looks like helping folks apply for pensions, benefits, housing, dental, or other applications. We helped with income assistance, disability applications, health care system navigation, advanced care planning, legal aid navigation, info and referral to mental health/substance use, treatment centers, and much more!
Information Dissemination	Newsletter: Mailed 5,820 newsletters to every Cherryville household. 12 unique issues sent to 485 mailing addresses per month. We hit 50 subscribers for our online version and distributed 480 between Canco and Franks Store.

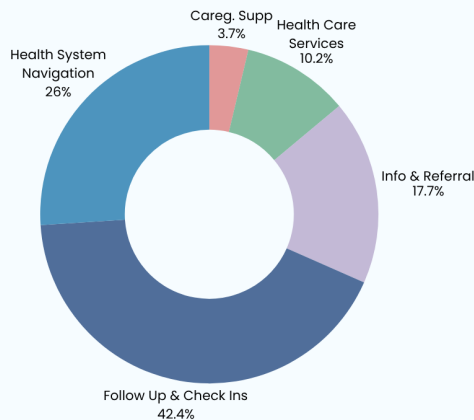

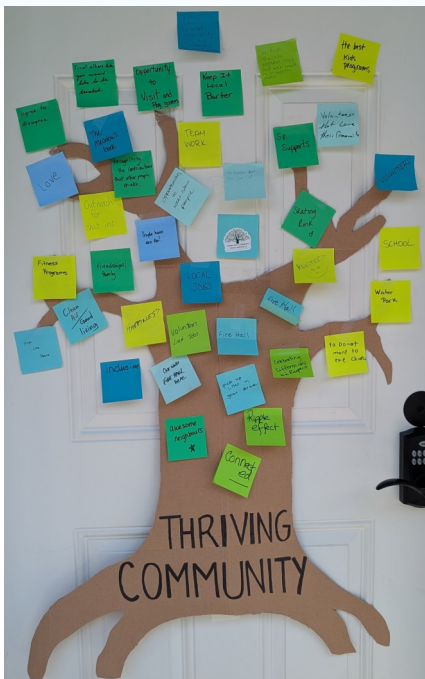

Total Monthly Hampers Includes Singles, Couples, Families of 3, Families of 4, and Families of 5+	479 Hampers 212 individuals served, 72 of them are children with an average of 40 hampers distributed per month.
Christmas Hamper Event	90 different family households received a large Christmas Hamper. 25 of the 90 are families who do not regularly receive monthly hampers.
After the Bell - Summer Lunch Program for Youth	245 lunches Distributed 18 different families, total of 33 children
Weekly Extras, Outdoor Fridge, Hampers	40,000+ lbs of food given out

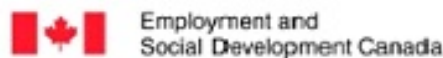
Conclusion
